Methodology

CIO Decisions launched the second annual Midmarket IT Leadership Awards program in December 2006 and promoted the program through e-mail to CIO Decisions magazine subscribers. The nomination process included a short Web-based questionnaire filled out by the nominator and a longer questionnaire completed by the nominee. This form included five essay questions on the following topics: leadership style; most successful working relationship with a business colleague; initiatives nominees launched in the past year that successfully aligned IT with business goals; measurable results of those initiatives; and how they would resolve upcoming challenges. A judging panel (see back page) then scored the nominations, rating each essay question for thoroughness and proven impact on the business.
